

Prof. Dr. Stefan Aykut, Assistant Professor of Sociology, Director of the Center for sustainable society research (CSS), University of Hamburg

Stefan Aykut is Assistant Professor of Sociology and Director of the Center for sustainable society research (CSS) at the University of Hamburg. He studied Social and Political Sciences and History at the FU Berlin, Sabanci University Istanbul and École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales Paris (EHESS). In his research, he examines how modern societies engage with global ecological problems - especially climate change - how ecological crises are scientifically interpreted, politically processed and channeled into programs of social change, and how new conflicts, but also new forms of social coordination, emerge in this process. Stefan published extensively on global climate governance and national energy transitions, and (co-)authored *Gouverner le climat? 20 ans de négociations internationales* (Presses de Sciences Po, 2015), *Globalising the climate: COP21 and the 'climatisation' of global debates* (Routledge, 2017) and *Climatiser le monde* (Quae, 2020).
