### Exchange and Networks

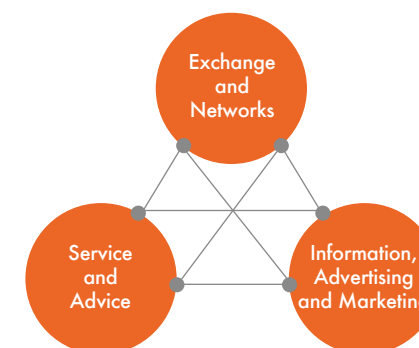
