



Multidisciplinary approach: Heidelberg University encourages research across traditional research boundaries


Strong network of local research facilities, e.g. Max-Planck-Institute, DKFZ (cancer research)

Programs on the BA level: German language knowledge required, even if a number of classes are taught in English


Programs from the MA that require German language knowledge (e.g. German studies, law)

First Steps in Research – Pursuing a PhD





Forms of PhD studies



Options (depending on the research field):

- Structured Program: Application at desired research facility (may include scholarship opportunities/research positions)
- Paid PhD positions: Job application (mainly in the natural sciences)
- Individual doctoral studies: Supervision by a professor (funding will be the candidate's responsibility)

Language requirements depend on the supervisor and the area of research

It is basically possible to earn a PhD in any of the fields that are taught at Heidelberg University

Personal contacts and one's own initiative are crucial!



Doctoral Programs in Heidelberg




In Heidelberg, there are three different forms of structured doctoral programs:

Graduate Schools (Graduiertenschulen) – large facilities with 150–300 doctoral candidates covering a wide range of research fields.

Research Training Groups (Graduiertenkollegs) – medium-sized groups with 15–50 doctoral candidates. The individual dissertation topics often come from a variety of research fields and faculties but are all focused within a defined topic area.

Research Training Groups (Promotionskollegs) – small groups with five to seven doctoral candidates covering very specific research questions.





Research position

 Apply for a paid research position (e.g. PostDoc, Junior Research Group Leader)

Research stay

- Heidelberg University has several teaching or research partnerships (e,g. HeKKSaGOn alliance) with universities or faculties in Japan (some with funding opportunities)
- Inquire with senior researchers about their network
- Secure external funding or make a financial plan (self-funded)
- Find a host researcher (hosting agreement)


