

Photo exhibition "Fascination of Science" at Miraikan

From September 29 – November 18, the photo exhibition "Fascination of Science" by the renowned German photographer Herlinde Koelbl will be shown at Miraikan – The National Museum of Emerging Science and Innovation in Tokyo. The exhibition is organized by the DWIH Tokyo (German Centre for Research and Innovation Tokyo) and co-organized by the Miraikan.

Who are the people behind the greatest discoveries of our time? And how would they summarize the essence of their research – in a sketch, formula, or a few words on the palm of their hand? The exhibition showcases portraits and quotations of 41 Nobel Prize Laureates and famous scientists from Japan and abroad as well as an interactive corner for participants to post about their own visions and research interests.

Herlinde Koelbl is one of the most famous German photographic artists. Her work has been presented in numerous exhibitions. More than a dozen photo books bear witness to Herlinde Koelbl's great work, including "Angela Merkel Portraits 1991 – 2021", "Fascination of Science", "The German Living Room", "Strong Women" and "Jewish Portraits". Her biggest project to date is the long-term study "Spuren der Macht" (Traces of Power), in which she photographed and interviewed personalities from politics and economics from 1991 until 1998.

Herlinde Koelbl about the exhibition at Miraikan:

During my last visit to Japan in 2022, I visited the Miraikan and I was thrilled about the concept and the program of the museum. That's why I'm delighted that my project "Fascination of Science" is now being shown there. I hope that many young people will be inspired by the fascinating personalities as role models and become enthusiastic about science and maybe even go into research themselves.

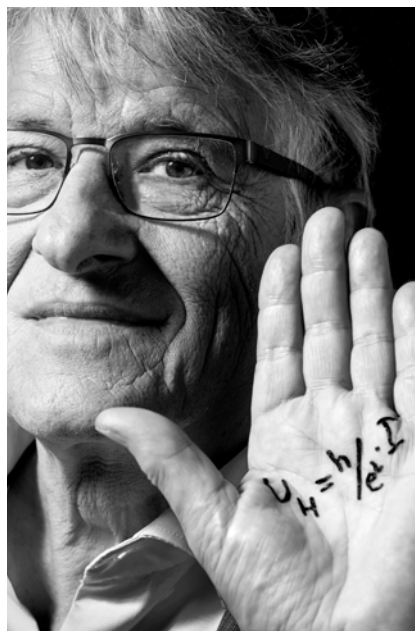
